#### Northern Erie Sno-Seekers advertising plan. 2008-2009 season

N.E.S.S. has 3 separate types of advertising each suited to a different need.

- 1. <u>Trail Heads</u>. 6 billboards approximately 4 feet wide and 7 feet tall to be placed at the main intersections and/ or trail head locations around the 125 mile+ trail system. These trail heads are where most snowmobilers stop to rest, view the guides, and gather information about the trail system. Each ad will be approx 12"x 16" one-color vinyl decal affixed to the billboard.
- 2. <u>Trail signs</u>. These signs can be placed anywhere along the trail and are highly visible way to advertise or direct traffic to a location. Typically they will show the establishment name and an arrow with distance to a location. They will be approx 16"x 24" one-color, lettered, corrugated plastic attached to a stake, post, or tree.
- 3. <u>Newsletter ads</u>. These ads run in our monthly e-newsletter that is sent to all 700+ members and 200+ landowners. Artwork copy is easily made from a business card.

All seasonal ads/signs are lettered only. Add \$15 to prices below for additional artwork or logos. Buy 3 or more and get a free ad on our website. Ads will run the entire season from fall to spring (except e-newsletter and website which run for 12 months). Deduct 50% for ads starting after Jan 31.

NYSSA is not publishing a print magazine due to the unexpected increase in price; however NYSSA does publish a monthly Online Magazine. The Online Magazine is packed with information each month, including a synopsis of every Board of Directors Meeting, news from our Trail Coordinator, and upcoming events. You can view it online on our website; it is also emailed to all members who have furnished their clubs/NYSSA their email addresses. If you are not receiving any information and have an email address please add your name to our mailing list by going to the NYSSA website www.nyssnowassoc.org and click on "Join our Mailing List".

#### **Register-Register-Register!**

The first snowfall of the year came through New York State this week. With less than two months before the official start to the snowmobile season, club volunteers have been busy preparing the trails for the winter, but it is that first snow that gets the juices flowing! Nothing like getting out in the woods on a chilly fall morning to pound stakes while walking on a thin crust of frost to set the mood. So- now that you have that beautifully poetic image... REGISTER YOUR SNOWMOBILES!!!

NYSSA is working hard to increase trail funding for the upcoming season. In fact, Governor Paterson set the trail budget at \$5.3 million but the catch is of course that we need registrations to provide the funding. If you are a NYSSA member who isn't able to make trail work days but still wants to do something to help, get your registrations in the mail to the DMV as soon as you can. November's registration totals will set the timing for snowmobile trail funding grants, so it is very important to NYSSA clubs to get as many snowmobiles registered before Thanksgiving. By registering on time, you can help the cash flow and keep NYSSA clubs in the black.

#### Join WHEREVER You Ride

The NYSSA online membership system makes it easy to join additional clubs. As you complete the membership form online, remember to support the clubs wherever you ride. Since the NYSSA membership is not collected when you purchase "secondary" memberships, it costs just \$20 for an additional single membership. That small amount can go a long way to help the clubs provide safer trails and a great snowmobile experience. If you have already joined a club, it is just as easy to go online now or during the season and add clubs to your membership. If you regularly ride on trails outside of your home base, make it a point to help out by joining. It is quick, affordable, and the right thing to do.

#### Keep it Safe, Keep it Fun!

Since snowmobiling is an off-road activity taking place in an unpredictable natural environment, it is not practical or possible to maintain all trails uniformly or to remove all unexpected or unknown trail conditions. The grooming and maintenance of trails, when provided, is meant solely to enhance the comfort and enjoyment of safe and prudent riders. When you venture out in to the winter cold, safety should be first and foremost. Keep in mind these tips so that your ride will be safe and enjoyable!

- Ride sober: don't consume alcohol prior to or while riding.
- Ride in control: at a prudent and reasonable speed for conditions.
- Ride Right: stay to the right side of the trail to help avoid collisions.
- Yield to Groomers: Grooming takes place at all hours, and groomers have the right of way at all times.
- Cross with care: Know the unique and particular dangers of ice and road crossings.

• Obey posted signs: Respect the landowners who have allowed the trail to pass over their lands - Stay on the trail! Dress for success:

- Clothing and boots designed especially for snowmobiling will be water-resistant, have reflective piping, and will keep you warmer than ordinary winter clothing.
- Avoid loose clothing or long scarves that could become caught in the machine and endanger you.
- Layering is the best way to dress because it is warmer and allows adjustment for changing conditions. Temperature, humidity, wind chill, and amount of protection from your snowmobile's windshield can vary greatly.
- New York State law requires all snowmobile drivers and passengers to wear a Snell or DOT approved safety helmet except when operating on private property owned by the driver or passenger.
- A helmet must be properly fitted and buckled up to provide protection. It should be snug but not uncomfortably tight.
- Always wear a smile, and be sure to pass it on to other winter trail users!

#### Trail Signs

Anyone that operates a snowmobile needs to understand that a snowmobile trail is not an engineered route. It follows the lay of the land. Trail signage is undertaken by clubs to make trails safer but only happens when each snowmobile operator does their share. Trail signage does not replace operator responsibility when operating a snowmobile. There are a few things that each snowmobile operator can do to make their snowmobile experience safe and enjoyable:

1. Always Stay Right on the trail. Hills and curves are particular areas in a trail system where staying to the right is especially important.

2. As your line of sight down the trail diminishes, so should your snowmobile speed. No snowmobile operator can predict what is oncoming or what any particular snowmobile operator may do.

3. Know and obey trail signs. Do you know what the Object Marker sign looks like and what it means?

4. Most trail signs are put up in the fall (by the hundreds of signs) and removed in the spring (by the hundreds of signs). A way to make trail safer is to help club volunteers. Contact your club so you can help.

On home page, click on the blue box half way down the page on the right side The box states: Join a Club Online -Click Here-

On the next page, scroll down to MEMBER LOGIN

This will ask for two items: First, your 6 digit NYSSA ID # (this can be found on your Blue NYSSA membership card from last year). Every renewing club member should have the membership card and will have a member id #. We have entered all 2007-2008 member info into the NYSSA site. The email address you have previously provided to us will be the email to which instructions will be sent.

If you have never logged into this page before, you will need to put your member id # in and then click the box to RESET PASSWORD. This will email you instructions and the link to reset your password.

Once you login your member information and your current club info will pop up and you will be able to renew membership by clicking on RENEW (highlighted blue).

This will bring up club info for you to select the club you wish to join. You will also have the option to join as an individual or family by clicking on the blue highlighted INDIVIDUAL or FAMILY (you must select one).

This will take you back one page where you will scroll down to the bottom of the page and you will see 1 item in your Shopping Cart click on PROCEED to CHECKOUT (highlighted in blue). You will then be able to enter your credit card information, the number of sleds you intend to register and your email address.

Click on the Pay Now button; this will bring up the page where you will be able to select a club. Click RETURN TO HOME (blue highlighted) to view membership and print voucher. Scroll down and click on VOUCHER (blue highlighted) this will take you to a pop up screen. To download, click on OPEN: voucher will open Adobe Acrobat. Print out your voucher and sign.

#### International Snowmobile Safety Week January 11-17, 2009

Snowmobile safety has always been a high priority with the snowmobile community. Beginning in the late 1980's the manufacturers, working closely with the International Association of Snowmobile Administrators and the state and provincial snowmobile associations, agreed that a specific week in January of each year should be set aside to highlight the snowmobile safety campaign.

This year, the International Snowmobile Safety Week will be held on January 11-17, 2009. Snowmobile Clubs and Associations are encouraged to sponsor safety related events to draw special attention to safe snowmobile behavior during that week. Elected Officials, community leaders, school teachers, safety trainers and more all work together to heighten the awareness for the need to have safe, responsible behavior while snowmobiling.

An integral part of safety week is the Safe Riders! You make snowmobiling safe safety campaign that was initiated in 1995. The safety program is widely endorsed and supported by snowmobile enthusiasts. 80% of all snowmobilers recognize the Safe Riders! Logo and understand the safety campaign position statements. The position statements of the campaign are clear and are as follows:

- Snowmobiling and alcohol don't mix, don't drink and ride.
- Know before you go! Always check local ice conditions.
- When night riding, slow down! Expect the unexpected.
- Ride safe, stay on the trail. Respect private property.
- Know the risks, be prepared and make every trip a round one.
- Cross with care. Don't become road kill.
- Snowmobiling is a fun family sport. Join us today.
- Ride smart, ride right. Stay in control.
- One is the loneliest number. Never ride alone.
- Promote your right to ride. Get involved.
- Smart riders are safe riders. Take snowmobile safety training.

The above position statements are all contained on the 11 separate 4-color posters that are available to state and provincial associations. Chambers of Commerce and Visitor and Convention Bureaus are encouraged to prominently display the posters and help communicate the positive messages to the snowmobiling public.

Materials in the Safe Riders! campaign also include the updated, Safe Riders! 22-minute safety video and TV and Radio ready public service announcements. The safety video serves as an excellent visual support for safety training and can be used at home and or in hotel lobbies to familiarize guests and family members of the importance of safe snowmobiling and related issues.

The campaign recognizes that many accidents occur because the rider has consumed alcohol which affects reaction time and judgement. Reaction time and judgement affect speed, cornering, good judgement and understanding the need for safe behavior. The manufacturers support the Safe Riders! campaign and all of the safety related efforts promoted by grassroots snowmobilers throughout North America. We encourage all of the snowmobile community members to visit the ISMA web site at www.snowmobile.org and order some safe riders!

Materials are available for distribution during your safety week efforts and throughout the year.
