Now get out and ride!




FROM THE NIAGARA COUNTY SIDE



Officers present: President – Eric Glassman Vice President – Dan Dressel Secretary – Mary Beth Kiesel Treasurer – Rich McNamara

Meeting called to order at 7:30 PM – 25 people present Meeting ended at 9:15 PM



Welcome:

Welcome to all. Thanks for coming! We have a lot of people that rode to our meeting tonight. Remember to register your sleds and your neighbor's sleds too! As of tonight we have 724 members!

Business Items:

- 1) Approval of minutes from last meeting. Eric G. makes a motion to approve minutes from last meeting. Rich P. seconds it. 25 in favor - 0 opposed. It's carried.
- 2) Dice run. We had a dice run last Sunday. We had 108 riders. Buck's Motorsports ran the event. Thank you Jan and Gloria, and Frank and Bev Schroeder, for your hard work. It was chilly, but everyone had a great time! We may just have another one before the season is through! Please see newsletter for more details.
- 3) Enjoy the City books. We sold many books this year. Thanks to all who purchased one!
- 4) Planning on going to Old Forge this year? There is a discount coupon for Waters Edge Inn & Conference Center on the NYSSA website. So if you have a minute take a look...
- 5) Safety Course. We are having a safety course at the Swormville Fire Hall on Saturday, January 29th from 9:00 am– 5:00 pm. Children 10- 17 years of age need to be certified with this course in order to ride their own sled with an adult present off their own land. We look forward to having Eric G., Dan D. and Rick J. teach the course. Breakfast and lunch will be served. Let's learn how to ride safe.
- 6) Clarence Winterfest at the Clarence Town Park on Main Street. We will have our NESS groomer on display for all to see! The festivities are on Sunday, January 30th. Come out and have some fun!!
- 7) Annual bon fire. We are all set for our bon fire. It will be on Saturday, February 5th at 4:00 pm ?. We will have hot dogs, hot chocolate, hot cider and more. The party will be on our C4C trail between Bloomingdale Road and Akron Road near on the power lines. If you would like to help at this event, just call the NESS phone: 741-NESS. Scott T. motioned to spend up to \$300 for bon fire. Rich W. seconds it. 10 in favor 0 opposed. It's carried.
- 8) RTP Grant. We didn't get the grant this year. We scored very well. Buffalo Olmsted parks won the grant. We may try again next time.

Trail System:

- 1) Trail canal path. New York State just cleared the way for snowmobilers to use the Canalway Trail. There are 280 miles of trail that parallel most of the NYS canal system in Upstate New York. There is an article on our website with more details. Curt W. may map route and get landowner permission. Then he would need to go the Royalton board and get permission. We could use some help to get this process started.
- 2) Accident on trail. Anytime there is an accident with injuries, our club needs to report accident to NYSSA and our own insurance company.
- 3) Our trails are great. We have had enough snow this year to groom our trails many times! It's time to have fun!!
- 4) Bike Path. A few of the barrels have been moved. Let's try to put them back in place if we notice they are tipped or not in the correct location. Please stay on trails or we will lose them. So far our groomers have spent 135 hours keeping our trails flat! Thank you, thank you and thank you groomers!! We have a few new groomers this year. 6 or 7 guys have "taken the seat". Keep up the good work!
- 5) Registration and Insurance for sleds. There has been a noticeable amount of law enforcement out on our trails this year. Be sure to have your sled registration and insurance card ready to show them it makes the stop go faster. We support them on our trails to keep us safe. Maybe there could be a sticker from DOT that we could put on each of our sleds to show we have reg. and ins. current for the season, then it would make for an even quicker stop along the trails.
- 6) A few of our closed trails are getting run. We really need to stay off closed trails since they are closed for a reason!! It's up to the landowners to let us know if people are riding on the closed trails.
- 7) Kinney Road. Don't groom to Transit Road. The town put up a new sign.
- 8) Ship & Shore. The airport on Transit please stay off the runway. The airport would like to know if we can run the groomer down the runway for a pontoon plane that will be landing. Ness decided to help and run the groomer to pan the snow for next weekend.

Marketing/Memberships:

- 1) Elections. March is the month for elections. Do you want to get more involved with our club?
- 2) Priorities for the year. We are reorganizing our committees. We have many different options for our members who want to get more involved in our club. We are trying to simplify the process to make it easier for members to participate!
- 3) Emergency response team. After the dust settled from the Thruway incident last month, the Thruway authority realized that they didn't' have a sufficient plan in place. Our club now is on their comprehensive phone tree if they need our groomer. We would then initiate our phone tree if needed.
- 4) Dave Perkins is retiring from NYSSA. Our club has decided to send a \$50 check and card to congratulate him on his retirement. Good luck Dave!
- 5) We had a 50/50. Congrats to Kevin K. He won \$78.00.
