

Growth goals

We're all enjoying summer as it finally got here. We just came of one of our best seasons in a long time partly because of the hard work and dedication of many. As we prepare for the new season, we have many goals and tasks to accomplish.

The board has been busy with many of the "daily" tasks that make this all work but I challenged them to come up with a few other things we all want and need. Below is a list we all came up with and agreed we would work on this year. Just for reference, I'm proud to announce that last year's list is complete so I look forward to setting some new goals of which, with everyone's help, we can accomplish again. Here they are:

- 1) Update website and logo. Align it with the message we want to project and make it more informative, easier to navigate, and include all the important things our members want to know. We're looking for input on this and would love some help so if anyone can lend a hand, please let us know!
- 2) Groomer/Equipment process. Improve scheduling, reporting, and train new operators to fill in the need of the additional unit. Provide instant feedback about trail conditions and any urgent notices.
- 3) Improve trail captain process. Better scheduling for work crews, inventory needs and landowner feedback. Recognize them through trail signs and trail heads.
- **4) Club promotion**. Improve overall perception of the snowmobile club. We are a family experience and want to let the public know about it. Support winterfests, rides, emergency response for towns/counties, etc.
- **5) Continue groomer barn project**. Develop a 2-5 year plan detailing costs, locations, funding options, expenses, etc. Accomplishing this is a large project and needs to be planned so we can be successful.
- **6) Develop committee project**. We all have a lot to do but when we break it down in manageable pieces, things happen. We all know how much volunteers are needed, but this will lay it out with specific responsibilities.
- 7) Rebuild trail heads. These are one of our main communication spots on the trail and should be upto-date with good guides, advertising, etc. New ones may be lighter and easier to install/take down.

I hope this gives you a good idea of our challenges ahead and hope you can help us get it done. If you notice, a few of these are not *directly* related to riding but all are important in order for that to happen. I often get asked "what do you guys do in the off season?" well, its things like this that make it all come together.

I hope you're enjoying your summer but please remember there is a lot to do. Come join us throughout the summer as we still meet on the last Thurs of the month. We all want to have a season as good as last year! Remember those flat trails?.....

Ray's '40' Years of Riding

When I first started snowmobiling, my first sled was a MotoSki from the early 1960's. At that time it was a good sled but when you were done riding you smelled like gas and oil because the carburetor was in the chest area. I even recall as a kid when my scarf would get sucked into it.







I then changed models and went to the Arctic Cat Panther, this was an upgrade from the MotoSki. From there I tried an Evinrude which was one of the first to have reverse, and mine did although the only drawback when you used reverse was getting stuck because the sled was so heavy.

I then went back to Arctic Cat for several years and this seemed to be a great sled. I even tried a Yamaha, which I did not like.

My next (and by far best sled I have owned) were several Ski-doo models. I have had 4 different models and at present I own a 2011 Sport which I am very pleased with the performance and ride.

If you are interested in helping, just show up! We meet at



Officers present: President – Eric Glassman Vice President – Dan Dressel Secretary – Mary Beth Kiesel

Meeting called to order at 7:45 PM – 12 people present Meeting ended at 9:45 PM

Welcome: Welcome to all. Thanks for coming!



Business Items:

Trail Grant – Phase I – With help from Curt, Bill, Eric and Mary Beth, the trail grant has been submitted for both Erie and Niagara counties. Gary Broderick made a change to a new application from a change form. We appreciate his help with this process. Thanks Gary!! Pete from Erie County also pitched in. Thanks Pete for your input!! The next Phase II is due October 1st which is for the final trail for season. Phase III is to document and send in support for the trail work.

Committees:

- 1) <u>Legal</u>. By-Laws. We did a final run through of the changes. There were a few questions that we discussed. One in particular was who is responsible for doing the paperwork for the trail grants. We decided that the President will coordinate and oversee the process. The trail coordinator will collect and input work logs and changes, then our treasurer will submit the required paperwork. Eric motions to spend up to \$800 for the lawyer to draft our changes. Mary Beth seconds it. Dan asks if there are any final questions, opinions or thoughts on the topic. There were none. 10 in favor 0 opposed. It's carried.
- 2) Emergency Response. No update.
- 3) <u>PR/Marketing</u>. We picked a winner for our July Landowner drawing. Congrats to: Walter Kohlhepp! You will be receiving a gift card in the mail soon.
- 4) <u>Fundraising</u>. There was no 50/50 tonight. We have a number of fall events coming up. We need to make some decisions about:
 - a. Buck's open house. The store may move event into September instead of October. Frank will talk with them about the details.
 - b. Labor Day fair. Dan will run like last year.
 - c. Don Georges. Dan will ask about details of event.
 - d. Pizza for Labor Day event. Eric will stop by and find out more details.
 - e. Eden Corn festival is looking for a group to run the parking for their event. We would get \$2,000 for our work. Let's find out more details and discuss at next meeting.



- 5) <u>Apparel</u>. Molly is the new apparel chairperson. We would like to order kid size short sleeve t-shirts. We would get 3 diff sizes for a total of 24 shirts. 



Snowmobile drivers take the plunge

What event happens twice each summer, combines snowmobiles with personal flotation devices, is held outdoors - but not canceled when it rains - can involve diving and is a real spectacle sport, complete with spectators?

It is the Nipmuck Trail Riders Snowmobile Club's Water Skip, held on the property of Martin Michalec in Union. Michalec, who is one of the original founders of the snowmobile club, hosts the event each year on the first Sunday of both July and August.

The July 3 water skip was favored by warm summer temperatures, and bouts of rain did not deter the many visitors who lined the shores of the small pond.

The water skip is primarily a recreational and fun event for club members, but also functions as a fundraiser through the sale of food during the competition. From parking cars to running the start line, snowmobile club members - who are required to donate volunteer hours to the club each year - help with the day-long functions.

Kevin Hunter, of Cheshire, the current national water skip champion, kept activities rolling.

"We basically do it just to run for fun. No trophies, no prizes. Everybody comes and has a good time," said Hunter, who explained that the machines are adapted to run on water. Their engines are sealed to protect them from water, and to protect the water from engine oil and fuel.

The racers make a donation to participate in the water skip. Those funds are used "to help maintain the retriever boats and the motors and keep everything running," said Hunter.

The water skip activities are a sight to see, featuring modified snowmobiles and drivers decked out in swim vests and helmets, as they compete in four-lap "oval" races around the pond's island, perform figure-eights, take recreational laps and launch from the water jump. Watching the snowmobile drivers dive for their sunken machines and be pulled from the water by a modified "floating wrecker" provides its own form of entertainment.

"It all looks so easy," said Michalec, who said it takes lots of practice and good balance to keep the snowmobile afloat.

The next water skip is scheduled for Aug. 7 and begins at 9 a.m.
