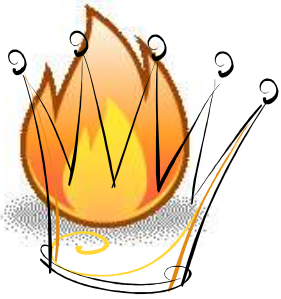
Anyone interested in painting stakes? This job can be done at your house and at your leisure as long as it gets done before the snow flies just let me know.

Meeting called to order at 7:05 PM – 10 people present
Meeting ended at 9:30 PM

Welcome: Welcome to all. Thanks for coming!

Open items from last meeting:

Accept minutes from last meeting. Ray motions, Frank seconds, 8 in favor – 0 opposed. It's carried.

RTP grant. No update.

Sno-phone. Our sno-phone is up and running.

NYSSA raffle. Nyssa is looking for donations for super raffle. Mary Beth motions to send \$250 check donation. Dave seconds. 8 in favor – 0 opposed. It's carried. Rick will send check with donation form. If any one has a donation, just let us know.
