The weekends can be quite busy out on the trails. These trips will give the traveling first timers a feel for overnight stays at hotels, motels, cabins, bed and breakfasts or wherever. The Phantom staved at a bed and breakfast with his brother one night while back packing (staying some place different every night) on sleds. B & B's are just that 'you'll get a bed to sleep in and breakfast in the morning-then you leave. In this case the Phantom and his brother stayed in a very nice woman's attic. In retrospect, it was the nicest place we stayed on that trip. In any event, it is an enjoyable memory that will always be cherished. Another Adirondack plus - it's still NYS-your registration is still valid which may not be the case in a neighboring state. The moral to the story-consider taking your winter hobby to the next level, you wont regret it.




