Greetings from The Phantom Snowmobiler

The Phantom tries to take a couple snowmobiling trips each winter. It surprises him that in conservation with other sled heads, how many people, especially younger people, have never ventured out of the area. Sure our trails are great, but it's a pretty big world out there just waiting to be explored on snowmobiles. The Phantom's recommendation for the first time trip planner, go to the Adirondacks. Tug Hill and Old Forge are two very popular spots for snowmobiles. Sleds are permitted on most roads and with the statewide effort for uniformed signage, he newbie will feel right at home on the trails. Old Forge requires a permit, reasonable in price,. Tug Hill does not. Why the Adirondacks for a first trip you ask? It's an easy tow down the thruway. 3 hours to Utica and head north up route 28 for an hour, puts you in Old Forge. Tug Hill is perhaps even a little closer. The Phantom advises a get away during the week as sled traffic is considerably lighter Monday thru Thursday. The weekends can be quite busy out on the trails. These trips will give the traveling first timers a feel for overnight stays at hotels, motels, cabins, bed and breakfasts or wherever. The Phantom stayed at a bed and breakfast with his brother one night while back packing (staying some place different every night) on sleds. B & B's are just that ' you'll get a bed to sleep in and breakfast in the morning-then you leave. In this case the Phantom and his brother stayed in a very nice woman's attic. In retrospect, it was the nicest place we stayed on that trip. In any event, it is an enjoyable memory that will always be cherished. Another Adirondack plus it's still NYS-your registration is still valid which may not be the case in a neighboring state. The moral to the story: Consider taking your winter hobby to the next level, you wont regret it.

- 1. <u>Legal Committee:</u> Responsibilities include handling our by-laws, insurance, legal actions and correspondence.
- 2. <u>Emergency Response Committee:</u> Help our communities in their time of need. Responsibilities would include coordinating, on our club side, a disaster response team including groomers, equipment and sleds.
- 3. <u>PR/Marketing & Advertising Committee:</u> Responsibilities include signs, selling ads for newsletters and trail head advertising.
- 4. <u>Fundraising Committee:</u> Fundraising items including coupon books, raffles, 50/50 and groomer boxes.
- 5. <u>Apparel Committee:</u> Responsibilities include ordering and distributing our NESS apparel.
- 6. <u>Social Committee:</u> Responsibilities include organization of all activities including Buck's open house, Don George's open house, Labor Day Fair booth, Labor Day Fair Pizza, Bon Fire, Christmas Party, Club rides, and Summer Events
- 7. <u>Membership Committee:</u> Responsibilities include receiving applications and processing memberships. Producing vouchers for sled registrations and decals with the temporary NESS membership cards. Responsibilities would also include distributing applications to various locations around town.
- 8. <u>Groomer/UTV Equipment Committee:</u> Responsibilities include keeping the groomers and drags in working order, organizing the grooming schedules for the winter and organizing groomer education/safety courses. Keeping UTV in working order and organizing UTV usage for trail work.
- 9. <u>Trail/Landowner Committee:</u> Responsibilities include coordination the county trail captains to see that their 3 or 4 mile stretch of trail is being taken care of and handling all landowner issues and requests. All trail openings and closings are determined by this committee. Erie County Niagara County
- 10. <u>Trail Guides Committee:</u> Responsibilities include distribute maps to establishments and collecting \$.
- 11. <u>Newsletter Committee:</u> Responsibilities would include creating each month and coordinate input from others and have ready to print our newsletter for either print or website.
- 12. <u>Website Committee:</u> Responsibilities would include moderating and update with activities and club news. Keeping the website functional and register users for site.
- 13. <u>Safety/Education Committee:</u> Responsibilities would include Setting up, organizing and running our courses and discussions at meetings.
- 14. <u>Adopt-A-Highway Committee:</u> Coordinate Fall & Spring clean-ups on Rt. 93 in Akron.
