

Just when the trails were looking nearly perfect, Mother Nature had to put her foot down and show us who is really in charge. Thanks to all who helped brush trails and cut new trails.






Here are our committees!

Objective of committee formation: Our club has the following committees to help utilize our membership and to make the process easy for you to get involved. We have tried to simplify and specify the responsibilities of our hard working volunteers.

- 1. <u>Legal Committee:</u> Responsibilities include handling our by-laws, insurance, legal actions and correspondence.
- 2. <u>Emergency Response Committee:</u> Help our communities in their time of need. Responsibilities would include coordinating, on our club side, a disaster response team including groomers, equipment and sleds.
- 3. <u>PR/Marketing & Advertising Committee:</u> Responsibilities include signs, selling ads for newsletters and trail head advertising.
- 4. <u>Fundraising Committee:</u> Fundraising items including coupon books, raffles, 50/50 and groomer boxes.
- 5. <u>Apparel Committee:</u> Responsibilities include ordering and distributing our NESS apparel.
- 6. <u>Social Committee:</u> Responsibilities include organization of all activities including Buck's open house, Don George's open house, Labor Day Fair booth, Labor Day Fair Pizza, Bon Fire, Christmas Party, Club rides, and Summer Events
- 7. <u>Membership Committee:</u> Responsibilities include receiving applications and processing memberships. Producing vouchers for sled registrations and decals with the temporary NESS membership cards. Responsibilities would also include distributing applications to various locations around town.
- 8. <u>Groomer/UTV Equipment Committee:</u> Responsibilities include keeping the groomers and drags in working order, organizing the grooming schedules for the winter and organizing groomer education/safety courses. Keeping UTV in working order and organizing UTV usage for trail work.
- 9. <u>Trail/Landowner Committee:</u> Responsibilities include coordination the county trail captains to see that their 3 or 4 mile stretch of trail is being taken care of and handling all landowner issues and requests. All trail openings and closings are determined by this committee. Erie County Niagara County
- 10. <u>Trail Guides Committee:</u> Responsibilities include distribute maps to establishments and collecting \$.
- 11. <u>Newsletter Committee:</u> Responsibilities would include creating each month and coordinate input from others and have ready to print our newsletter for either print or website.
- 12. <u>Website Committee:</u> Responsibilities would include moderating and update with activities and club news. Keeping the website functional and register users for site.
- 13. <u>Safety/Education Committee:</u> Responsibilities would include Setting up, organizing and running our courses and discussions at meetings.

Greetings from The Phantom Snowmobiler

As the Phantom writes this, the area is in the midst of a January thaw. The Phantom hopes everyone got out at least once on their snow buggies! When the snow was on the ground, the re-occurring theme of all the feedback he has heard was the same thing-the trails were in better condition than expected! Any miles you might have put on this month most likely exceeded total mileage you may have put on our area trails all of last season.

The Phantom was able to put on 200 miles around town during the brief snow cover. If the Phantom wore a hat he would tip it to the NESS groomer operators! They were all over the snow, ensuring everyone's hopes were exceeded, as to what trail conditions might be. The long range forecast predicts winter-like conditions to return shortly. The Phantom would like to touch on common courtesy on the trails.... Some may view the Phantom as again harping on this often visited subject, but in his 200 miles out on the trail it has become apparent to the Phantom that not everybody reads his column! A few brief points:

- 1) When stopping, pull over to the side of the trail in a safe spot and form a single file. Don't stop double file and don't clog intersections.
- 2) Stay on the trail and respect the landowner. You see the signs on the trail, they are self explanatory and easy to follow.
- 3) Always be ready to lend a hand to anybody who needs it.

This includes pedestrians, motorists and snowmobilers.

Every single snowmobiler represents the entire snowmobiling community, act accordingly. This message is directed to younger sledders, as well as older ones, who are young at heart and perhaps don't always think about the consequences of their actions. The Phantom doesn't write from the position of criticism - young snowmobilers are the future of our sport - he writes from experience. The phantom has been lurking out on the trails for 30 years and yes, he was once young...enjoy the season, there will be more snow, Be safe and courteous. **Until then... The Phantom Snowmobiler-he see's ALL**





Sled Of The Month Page

It all started when I was about 9 years old and saw the sleds going by on a trail in front of my house. I would often run to the window when I heard one coming just to see it go by. Soon, some of my friends & families got sleds and I finally got a chance to ride one. That was all it took. There was little else I wanted at that age but a snowmobile. Problem was my parents weren't buying it. My dad probably got tired of me asking so I did the next best thing I could – I built one! I mounted an old mini bike engine and chain case to the back of my runner sled! A few modifications to the





steering and...well...it wasn't much of a sled nor did it go very far, but it sure kept me busy and I had fun doing it! I even remember writing letters to all the manufacturers asking for brochures so I could look at all the cool new stuff! There were dozens of brands to pick from and I still have some of those old pamphlets! The only thing I knew for

sure was that I was passionate about snowmobiles!





Fast forward 10 years when I got my first real job and could finally afford a real sled – a 1979 John Deere Trailfire. Soon after, I added a used 1975 Polaris TX 440 to the mix.

There wasn't much of trail system back then but I still managed to go about 200 miles a year. Pretty impressive since I never once left Grand Island! These 2 sleds scratched the itch for the next 10+ years as I then started a family and didn't have much time to ride.

As my son and daughter grew up and became interested, I got back into the sport with similar passion as I did when I was younger. I sold the 2 old horses and bought a '96 Indy 500 and a '97 Indy Lite Deluxe. I then joined the (newly formed) NESS snowmobile club.



Our family would ride double around the trails on these two machines and then ventured off to Old Forge and Canada. We enjoyed it so much that I added a few more machines to the list. And then a few more. We now average 1500 miles a year. As I became more active in our club, I found out that not only did I enjoy the riding part, but also the friendships I made in helping NESS grow into what it is today - the <u>"Best trails in WNY"!</u> My family (especially my son) has clearly been "bitten" by this bug and they all enjoy this sport as much as I do.

It started when I was 9 years old but I'm pretty sure it's still with me. 26 snowmobiles later, (not counting the one I built) and I still go to the window to watch one go by.
