





For information leading to the arrest / conviction of the person(s) responsible for running over <u>ALL</u> the trail markers & signs on trail S41E (trail from Clarence Pizza Co. in Clarence Center, Goodrich Rd. to Salt Rd.)

On Thursday Feb. 18, sometime BEFORE 1:46pm, our sergeant at arms & trail captain Jeff G. was heading out for a ride, and found fresh tracks of a single snowmobile who had deliberately driven over all the trail markers and signs from Goodrich Rd. (trail starts) to Salt Rd. It was a fresh, single track, and from the ski-stance & tracks, it looks to be an older snowmobile. And from the direction they were ran over, the sled was headed East, so they started at Goodrich Rd., and drove East to Salt road. There were 30+ trail markers / sign stakes that were broke off at the ground, and were no longer useable. There were also 10+ signs that were damaged from being run over as well. The custom Clarence Pizza Co. sign at the trail head was ruined also. If you think we are overreaching , think again !!! The Stop signs & Stop Ahead signs were also knocked down, creating a very serious safety issue. The broken stakes were broke off protruding out of the frozen ground and snow, creating further safety issues for snowmobiles, riders and farmers or landowners. A frozen stake buried in the snow will easily puncture a tire(s) causing \$1,000's of damage !!! Trail coordinator AL was quick to respond, and spent 3 hours of his time repairing the damage.

...We can never thank you enough for your permission to use your land as part of our trail system. Most of you probably don't get as excited as we do about lots of snow, and continued cold weather, but we sure do !

It's been a few years since we have had a real opportunity to ride our trails when they are in good to excellent condition. As always we treat your land with respect, and when we are crossing it, we treat is as if it was our own. When we get such great weather and enough snow to open up our trails, our club becomes a piece of the puzzle that when conditions are right, and a blanket of snow covers the whole state, our club interconnects with our adjacent snowmobile clubs, that connect with 100's of other clubs all across New York state, that opens up a snowmobile trail network that gives us access to 10,500+ miles of snowmobile trail across the entire state. Many of our club members have ridden their snowmobiles from their own back door to destinations such as Letchworth State Park and towns in the Southern-tier like Arcade. Bliss. Springville. We've had club members ride East into the Finger Lakes Region, and up to Hilton, NY. Some have ridden further South and West into Chautaugua County and on to the Pa line. There are snowmobile trails North of us as well, there have been club members that have ridden all the way to the shores of Lake Ontario. Many of our club members have traveled 1,000's of miles on their snowmobiles this season, covering 100's of miles in a single day. I just wanted to take a moment to thank you, and let you know what an integral part of an interconnecting trail system that brings a great deal of revenue to businesses all across our state. Not to mention all the joy it brings to the families that spend every moment they can on their snowmobiles out on our trails.



### Bridge Construction Projects

We have some bridges mostly in Niagara county that are in desperate need of some serious repair. With the heavy traffic we have seen this winter, and

the grooming frequency, these bridges need some attention, and at least one needs complete replacement. The wood for decks on these bridges is already lined up. We do however need steel to build or repair the frames. "I" beams are great if anyone has any info on them or know where any are. Our "go to" of choice for steel substructure that works extremely well is the square tubing that is used for bumper railing on the sides of roads. It's galvanized, and heavy wall, so it lasts a long time, and very strong to handle heavy groomers. If you see some on a job site, or in a scrap yard, or where ever, let us know.
