Take the time, and make plans to stop out for this months meeting, meet the new officers, find out what some of our plans are for 2022.

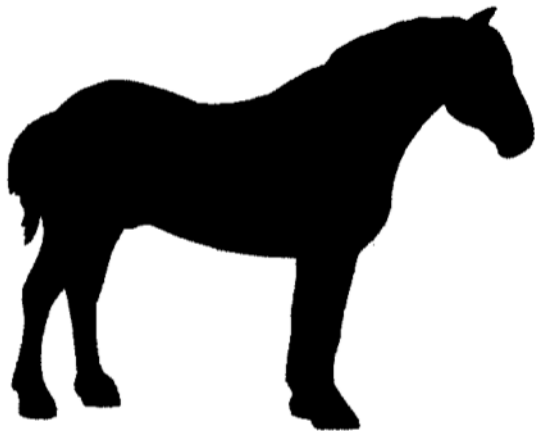

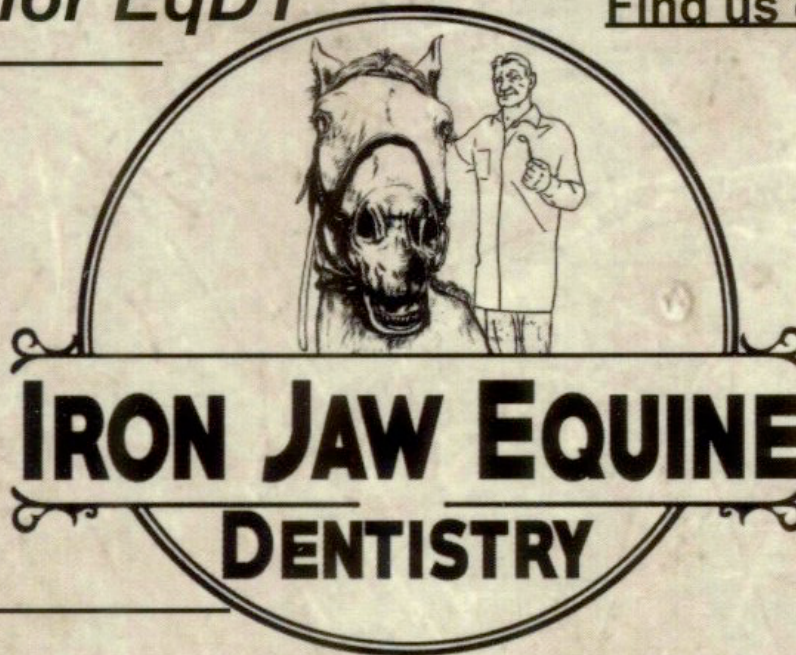

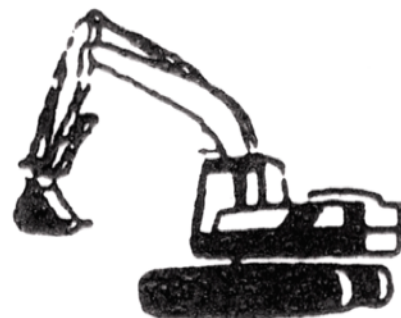

**IMPORTANT TRAIL INFO**



As most (if not all of you) are aware of we had a serious trail issue throughout this past season, on a section of trail between Westwood Rd. & Rte #20 (Broadway) in Alden. It's not officially our trail, the trail belongs to our neighbors to the South, The Sno-Mob, but it has huge impacts on our trail system, and or neighboring clubs. The issue was the Norfolk - Southern live rail line. They removed the crossing that was used to cross the tracks on C4B, and there was no re-route available. It caused some safety issues with sleds "renegading" ways to get around the tracks, and homeowners complaining about sleds in their front yards, and on their driveways on Sandridge Rd. Our club was contacted in late Feb. to see if we could help resolve the issue. We've had multiple meetings with landowners, trail captains, Sno-Mob officers, and club members from the area. We called in ECFOSC (Erie County Federation of Snowmobile Clubs) president Dave Waples and Roger McCabe for assistance also. Rich has been "lead dog" on this project, and as usual, he's going at it with both barrels blazing !!! The rail roads are under federal law, which makes them quite difficult to deal with, and they don't have any desire to work with a couple of snowmobile clubs. Rich has been devoting a great deal of time and resources working with the Sno-Mob and all involved parties to get this crossing back in for 2022 season. As one of the handful of NESS officers involved on this project, it's been a real pleasure working with the Sno-Mob to get this problem fixed for the benefit for both our clubs. If you can be of any assistance on this, please contact us.

# Season End Stats

As we pack everything up and say good bye to the 2021 season, here are a few facts and numbers, all in regards to New York State snowmobiling.

\* NYS registrations were up above numbers we haven't seen in the past 5 years. There were 115,601 snowmobiles registered this year. In 2014 we had 120,000 sleds registered, since then it's been a steady decline, with a few years dipping below 90,000 registered sleds.

\* The NYSSA interactive web map continues to gain popularity. There were 6330 downloads of the app. to Apple products (phones). There were 3450 Android downloads of the app. Honestly I found that number to be surprisingly low, I would have guessed higher, but there are other apps. out there that are pre-installed on sleds that are equally as good and useful.

\* Unfortunately, as of this report, there have been 13 fatal snowmobile accidents in NYS, resulting in 15 deaths so far this season. 7 (seven) of them have been club members; 1 was on a highway (Interstate 787 in Albany), 3 were drownings, 1 accident was in the person's backyard, and 7 were ON a NYS Parks and/or club- maintained trail. Days of the week: Mon (1); Tues (1); Weds (1); Thursday (3); Friday (3); Sat (4); and Sunday (2). The average age of the victims is 38 years old.

\* Club memberships were up 14% across the state, although they were not distributed equally. "Smaller clubs" saw a 6% drop in club membership, while "Larger Clubs" saw the big up tic in club memberships, the demographics seem to point to "the high snow areas" and "Large Clubs" being one in the same. There were 21,870 NON-Club registrations, this is concerning because it's up significantly, and it represents just shy of 20% of all registered sleds. NYSSA is already working on a NON-Club member registration fee increase. There is talk of raising it \$5.

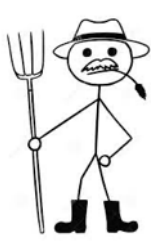

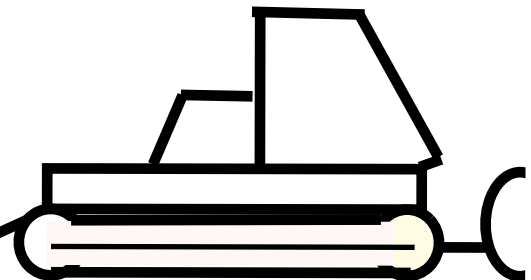

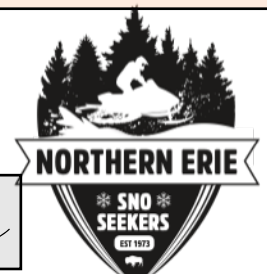

<b>Trails &amp; Landowners</b>	Al, reported that most trails are down, a few remain, Rich reported on the meeting with the landowners and club members from Marrilla in regards to the trail from Dibble RR to Rte #20 a important, next meeting will be held with Marrilla board members and any officers from their club will be held at a landowners house next week to further discuss this issue Rich reported that Ron, Rich, and AL met and updated the landowner list, and trail captain list. Trail captains, please don't put anything in the old truck bodies, storage sheds by the old trooper barracks, we want to clean them out, if you need someplace to put stuff, contact Ron. Ron reported that former president Eric, contacted him, and offered / added \$250 to the reward offered in regards to the person(s) responsible for running over our trial markers back in late Feb., there have been no lead or further information on that issue. King Oil has made a \$400 groomer fuel donation to the club, a thank you card will be sent out to them for that generous donation !!!! A gift card will be sent to Michel Stall, who was kind enough to pull groomer #1 out to the road in when it broke down last month. Rich reminded everyone that trails need to be marked, with thoughts of the groomer coming through, the placement of stop signs, corners, trail in general need to be wider. There are just to many tight places where it's almost impossible to get our 40' long groomers through.
<b>NEXTERA/NEETNY (Power Line Project)</b>	Rich reported that work has started on this project And reminded everyone that the project will effect our trials for the coming year
<b>NESS Memorial</b>	Rich reported on a idea to set up something to honor past outstanding club members, officers and such. We need ideas from club members. This will take much discussion over time, looking for input from everyone on this issue.
<b>Groomer Barn</b>	Rich reported he has talked with the town of Clarence supervisor, also the Town of Clarence HWY superintendent, he had good conversations with both, and interaction with all involved will continue, the location of Salt Rd on the bike path was discussed, along with other possible areas that the town has mentioned.
